

Dear Friends







10th Year of DURGA PUJA in Hong Kong

The Hong Kong Bengali Association was officially established in December 1998. Members of the Bengali community nominated a steering committee in early 1998 to establish the Hong Kong Bengali Association. This committee was authorized to form the first Executive Committee of the Hong Kong Bengali Association. Many members of the steering committee and the first Executive Committee have since left Hong Kong. A few of us are still here including: Sharmistha Chaudhury, Pradip Putatunda, Sanjib Sengupta, and myself.

Until 1998, we used to only celebrate Saraswati Puja & organize a get-together for Bijoya. The Saraswati Puja was always held at the Hindu Temple in Happy Valley. The 'Bijoya Sammilani' used to be held at one of the Indian restaurants soon after the puja. One of the attractions of the Bijoya get-together was a 'lucky draw' which community members always enjoyed.

When our HKBA was formed, the Executive Committee & the members of the Association had a strong desire to have Durga Puja celebration here in Hong Kong as it is considered the biggest festival for Bengalis. As a result, we were able to organize and celebrate Durga Puja in Hong Kong for the first time in 1999. In fact, we also placed an advertisement in the South China Morning Post announcing that there would be a Durga Puja celebration.

Although Durga Puja is primarily seen as a Bengali celebration, the organizers have always invited and encouraged members from all communities and religions to join in the festivities. We have welcomed many members of other communities over the years to our Puja. This year marks the 10th year of celebrating Ma Durga in Hong Kong.

Here in Hong Kong, we Bengalis have few community-related occasions where we get together, talk with our friends, colleagues, and relatives, chat about our respective professions, and express opinions about the conditions back in India, politics, Bollywood, and NRI-related issues. Hence, although the Pujas are religious occasions, we treat them as social, cultural, and communal rejuvenating gatherings – never to be missed!

One thing I can proudly say is that we have never compromised the serenity and values of the Puja itself. Organizers have always been careful and attentive to every detail of the Puja as asked and directed by the Priest. Our Priest is Shri ShaktiPrasad Mukherjee ('Shakti da' to all of us) and he has served as our priest for the past 10 years. Shakti da travels from Kolkata every year for our puja.

There was a big change in 2007 when the Puja venue needed to be relocated. We were told by the Hindu Temple Management that the Hindu Temple could not accommodate Durga Puja due to unstable conditions of the building- specifically the Mohan Hall. So, the Association found no option but to relocate the Puja venue to the Community Hall in Yau Ma Tei. We, as a community, must express our deep gratitude to the Management Committee of the Yau Tsim District Council whose cooperation and active help to our organization was overwhelming. At the same time, I must express my sadness at the fact that the Durga Puja, a Hindu Religious festival, could no longer be organized at the Hindu Temple.

Over the years, many members of the Association have contributed to the success of our Durga Puja. From time to time, we are also graced with the presence of parents of our members during the Puja. It gives us great pleasure to see some of our parents appreciating what we do miles away from home.

On that note, I would like to earnestly request all of you to come forward before, during, and even after the Puja to help your Association to organize the Pujas & other events. This is your Association. Some of us have been here longer than others but I believe that we all share the same goal & responsibility for the betterment of our community.

Origin of Durga - The Mythology

Devi is the great goddess of the Hindus, the consort of Shiva and she is worshiped in various forms corresponding to her two aspects: benevolence and fierceness. She is Uma, "light"; Gauri, "yellow or brilliant"; Parvati, "the mountaineer"; and Jagatmata, "the-mother-of-the-world" in her milder guise. The terrible emanations are Durga "the inaccessible"; Kali, "the black"; Chandi, "the fierce"; and Bhairavi, "the terrible."

Descent of the Goddess

Durga, a beautiful warrior seated upon a tiger, was the first appearance of the great goddess. The circumstance of her miraculous arrival was the tyranny of the monster-demon Mahishasur, who through terrific austerities had acquired invincible strength. The gods were afraid of this water-buffalo bull because neither Vishnu nor Shiva could prevail against him. It seemed that only the joint energy of Shakti was capable of vanquishing Mahisha, and so it was the eighteen-armed Durga who went out to do battle.

Battlefield

She went to battle on her ferocious mount lion, armed with the weapons given to her by the other Gods. Durga is one of the angry and aggressive aspects of the goddess Shakti, whose role in Hindu mythology was to fight and conquer demons and also personify the Sakti or female aspect of any male deity. In the battle, she fought and killed the evil Mahishasura and restored heaven to the Gods. Since then the goddess is invoked for protection from the powers of evil. Durga Puja is observed in her honor, to celebrate her victory over evil.

Revered Mother

She has been worshiped from about 400 AD, but probably earlier, to the present. Her literary references are chiefly the Ramayana and Mahabharata, epic and Puranic texts, and she is mentioned by name in Vedic literature. In general, Durga is regarded in northern India as the gentle bride epitomizing family unity while in southern India she is revered more in her warrior aspect.





The Bengali Belief

Sati, the consort of Shiva was the daughter of Daksha Prajaapati a descendant of Bhrama. Sati had married Shiva against the wishes of her father. Daksha was sponsoring a sacrifice and attendees came from various parts of the universe. He invited all of the gods and goddesses except his son in law Shiva. Against Shiva's wishes, Sati attended this sacrifice and was insulted by her father. Unable to bear this insult, Sati immolated herself.

Enraged at the insult and the injury, Shiva destroyed Daksha's sacrifice, cut off Daksha's head and when pleaded by other gods, replaced it with that of a goat and restored him to life. Still berserk with grief, he picked up the remains of Sati's body, and danced the dance of destruction throughout the Universe. The other gods intervened to stop this dance, and the disk of Vishnu cut through the corpse of Sati, whose various parts of the body fell at several spots all through the Indian subcontinent and formed the sites of what are known as Shakti Peethas today.

Shiva was finally pacified when the last piece fell off from his shoulder. Narayana revived sati as Uma for a new life. Ever since peace was restored, Uma, with her children, Ganesh and Kartik, and with her two 'sakhis' - Jaya and Bijaya, comes to visit her parent's home each year during the season of 'Sharat' or autumn when Durga Puja is celebrated.


After a long and gruelling week at school, exciting though it may have been, I was often ready to crash at home, and would have liked nothing better than to step out the school's front gate and straight into the front door at home. (By which I mean doorway, for to walk into a door would have hurt.) Unfortunately, reality was not so kind; the actual journey consisted of taking a minibus, followed by the KCR, then the MTR, and finally a second bus ride - two hours on (or under) the roads of Hong Kong before I could collapse on a sofa at home.

Now I suffer from a peculiar ailment – I cannot stay awake in a vehicle. Ten minutes into any road trip and I will no doubt have dozed off peacefully. Thus it was with great surprise that I found myself becoming more alert as my journey would progress, with my wakefulness reaching a crescendo as the 70 pulled into the bus stop at home. There is something invigorating about returning home.

As I grew longer in the tooth, so too my travels grew longer as I moved further afield. Enthralled though I was by the many sights and sounds of Cambridge and Los Angeles, the greatest pleasure of all was reserved for the return to Hong Kong. This affinity for homecoming was tested most strongly this summer, when my itinerary involved four airports, three airlines, two days and one very weary traveller. Had I been faced with this convoluted route on my way out, I would no doubt have given up halfway through; coming home, though, I almost – dare I say it – *enjoyed* it. Such is the wonder of the journey home!

That's not to say I'm not waiting for them to bring back the Concorde.
